Rose G. Wilson, age 81, passed away Wednesday, March 12, 1980 at the Platte County Memorial Hospital, in Wheatland.

Rose Lewis was born Sept. 24, 1898 in Nebraska, the daughter of Charles William and Minnie Dennis Lewis. She was raised in Nebraska and attended college there. Upon completing her education, she taught school for a short time in Nebraska.

She then moved to Guernsey, Wyo. where she was employed at the bank. While working in Guernsey, she met O.B. Wilson and they were married in Douglas, June 28, 1919. She and Dr. Wilson returned to Guernsey where he practiced Dentistry.

In 1926 they moved to Wheatland where she made her home until the time of her death. Dr. Wilson preceded her in death in December of 1976.

Rose was a 50 year member of the Eastern Star, and past-president of the Ameri-

can Legion Auxillary. She had also been active as a Girl Scout Leader and a member of Jobs Daughters in Wheatland.

She is survived by 2 sons, Dr. William Wilson of Wheatland and Dr. Robert Wilson of Sheridan, Wyo. She is also survived by 6 grandchildren.

She was preceded in death by her husband, 2 brothers, Tom and Frank Lewis; her parents and 1 granddaughter.

Funeral Services were held Saturday, March 15, at the Schrader-Prell Funeral Chapel with the Rev. Delbert Dick officiation. Burial was in the Wheatland Cemetery.
