

WILSON, WILLIAM C.  
May 30, 1898-February 11, 1931

Word was received in Wheatland Wednesday that Willie Wilson, son of Mr. and Mrs. Chas. Wilson, pioneer ranchers of the Laramie river, died at Morgantown, N.C. that afternoon.

Mr. Wilson, in the company of his cousin, Mrs. Sidney Magee, left in November for North Carolina for a visit with relatives and were planning on returning to Wheatland in a few days. The first of the week, the deceased contracted pneumonia, and his condition, while serious from the start, became worse, and his end was a shock to his family here.

The body is expected to be shipped from Morgantown Friday and should reach Wheatland Monday night or Tuesday morning and will be accompanied on the home trip by Mrs. Magee. The Longwith-Richards Funeral home will take charge of the body upon its arrival here, but at the present time, funeral arrangements have not been made.

Mr. Wilson was born and raised in this community and made his home with his parents on their ranch near the Wheeler bridge. Besides his parents, he is survived by six brothers, Sam, Stanley, Robert, Davis, Dolph and Horace, and two sisters, Mildred Wilson and Mrs. Jack Conner.
