

WYDA, MATTHEW  
January 21, 1891-July 21, 1946

Matthew Wyda was killed Sunday at 2:30 p.m. on the Webb canyon road, one mile north of Hartville when the jeep in which he was riding skidded 180 feet and overturning and pinning him underneath the machine. Death was caused by a fractured neck and basal skull fracture.

Born January 21, 1891 in Seic, Yugoslavia, he came to this country 35 years ago. At the time of his death, he was a resident of Lance Creek and was employed at the Kent store. Prior to that time he made his home in Sunrise and worked at the Colorado Supply store.

Mr. Wyda is survived by two step-sons, Alan Hall of Pueblo, Colo. and Harlan Hall at the present time in the U.S. Coast Guard.

Funeral services were held Wednesday, July 24, at 2 pm. at the Sunrise Community Church, Rev. W.W. Maxwell officiating.
